Panasonic is urging its staff in Japan to buy the company's products to help it weather the economic slowdown. The campaign is voluntary but in Japan where many people still aspire to a job for life, company loyalty is held at a premium. Like other Japanese manufacturers, Panasonic is being hit hard by falling demand for its products worldwide. From Tokyo, our correspondent B.B. reports.

Panasonic says it wants to encourage company solidarity with its campaign for senior employees to buy its own goods as well as improve its sales. Executives and senior managers are being urged to spend 200,000 yen on products such as flat screen televisions and refrigerators by July. That's more than 2,000 dollars. Middle managers are being asked to make purchases worth 100,000 yen. The "Buy Panasonic" scheme follows an earlier initiative at Toyota which encouraged managers to get a new car to boost morale. Panasonic is expected to make a net loss of more than 4bn dollars by the end of the financial year in March. It's cutting 15,000 jobs worldwide and closing plants. Other Japanese exporters such as Sony and Nissan have also forecast massive losses and a tumbling demand for their products worldwide. The high value of the Japanese yen is reducing the value of the sales they do make abroad.
